

Cook four chicken breasts in the microwave on high for 7-8 minutes. (I prefer to brown them in a frying pan)

Blanch 1½ pounds of cut up broccoli in

Place cooked chicken on broccoli.

2 cans cream of chicken soup

1 cup mayo

1 tsp. curry powder

1 cup shredded cheese

Spread a cup of bread crumbs over top. Bake in microwave on high for 10-12-minutes or oven bake at 350 degrees for 30-40 minutes.

The monthly residents meeting for December was held on December 5th and was called to order by Ken Camp. The minutes of the November meeting were previously provided for residents to look at and were accepted by voice vote. Art Roberts presented the Treasurers Report for both the month of November as well as a recap of all financial transactions from the time he had taken over as Treasurer at the beginning of April 2009. These reports were also approved by a voice vote of residents present. Art also provided an update on the move of the activities organization funds from Wells Fargo Bank to M&I Bank. This had been discussed at the meeting in November because of Wells Fargo's change in their fees that impacted our funds in that institution. Art requested the resident's to approve writing the necessary checks to open up a new account at M&I Bank and to subsequently close the account at Wells Fargo. His request was seconded and subsequently approved by a voice vote.

Connie Riter raised an issue of a family named Tucker living in Queen Creek which was experiencing extreme personal and financial issues as a result of Mr. Tucker having just learned he had a very aggressive form of Cancer and having been apparently given a matter of days to weeks to live. Friends and others were seeking any donations that might help the family, particularly in an effort to at least give the three children some sort of Christmas and Connie was asking if there were those in the park that might wish to help. With a short speech by Jim McKersie as well as a donation to get the ball rolling a total of over \$300 was raised just from those at the meeting with promises of more to come. It was a wonderful display of concern and sharing by the people who live here for those who may be suffering through hard times at this time of the year.

The members chosen to fill the three open board positions were verified by a simple vote of residents present as all were running without opposition. Those members include Judy Quetschenback as the new Secretary, Art Roberts to continue as Treasurer, and Dick Smith who will serve as the new board member at large. Congratulations to all the new members.

There were reports from various committees including one on the results of the combined patio, white elephant, book, and baked goods sale. The organization realized a gain of approximately \$500 total from the white elephant sale, book sales, and sale of baked goods. Thanks to all who made this event so successful.

Ken Camp brought up a request to change the starting times for the monthly pot luck suppers to allow the cleanup crews to be able to finish up and get out at a reasonable time. As a result during the coming year potluck suppers will start with Happy Hour at 4:30 with dinner beginning at 5:00. This was approved by a vote of residents present. There will also be a change in how the 50/50 is handled. Art Roberts and Dick Smith will handle the 50/50 for all special events. Rather than going around the room giving out tickets and collecting for the 50/50, they will have the tickets available at the front door so that when residents arrive they can get their tickets at that time. There will no longer be roving ticket sellers at the special events.

The meeting was adjourned and many of the residents stayed to help put up the Christmas decorations and we wish to thank all those who participated.

GOOD NEWS ANNOUNCEMENT

Landscape Pick-Up

Effective December, 2009



American Land Lease announced that Desert Harbor has a new provider for trash pick up which includes the removal of our landscape waste cuttings. Landscape waste may now be picked up with regular trash on Monday and Thursday. The first Wednesday of the month for landscape waste NO LONGER applies.

Preparation of landscape waste material must still be properly contained and tied in bundles. Bundles must not be longer than four (4) feet in length. All debris containing thorns, needles, or other sharp protrusions must be placed inside a disposable container, preferably cardboard boxes. Saguaro cacti and palm trees will not be picked up. Palm tree trimmings, however, are acceptable. Please make sure that tree limbs are bundled together and no larger than 12 inches in diameter.

Boyce Thompson Arboretum by Kay

Boyce Thompson
Arboretum is located on
Highway 60 outside of
Superior. The elevation is
2,400 feet and is slightly cooler
than the Valley of the Sun.

The Arboretum offers hiking trails through the cactus gardens, Ayer Lake, volcanic rock formations and a path alongside Queen Creek.


The trail is a 1.5 mile loop and parts of it are accessible by wheelchair.

More than fifty acres of developed gardens let visitors learn about desert landscaping, birdwatching and Sonoran ecology. Each season offers something new in plant life and birding.

The Arboretum
opened in 1925 and has
become a botany
research affiliate
of the University of
Arizona's College of
Agriculture and Life
Sciences and a State Park.

Colonel William Boyce
Thompson founded the
arboretum because he
wanted "to instill in people an
appreciation of arid land plants
through fostering education,
recreation, research and
conservation". He was an early
silver and copper baron with
investments in Superior, Globe
and Miami mines.


There is a museum, bookstore and a wide selection of desert plants for sale. There are also guided tours available.

Sunday-Thursday 10:30am to 10:00pm Friday-Saturday 10:30am to 11:00pm


