

Before people make that choice, you need to know a little more about this interesting man called Joe Schnier, president of our Activities Org! A closer look reveals that he was born in Quincy, Illinois on July 31, 1942. It's a small town in western Illinois on the Mississippi River just 2 hours from St. Louis and 20 minutes from Hannibal, MO.,home of Mark Twain.

Fresh out of hi school, Joe served in the Navy as an electrician but soon got the love bug and married a young lady named Barb on April 20, 1963. Almost 44 years later, the Schnier family moved to Arizona and finally settled at Desert Harbor in November of 2005 with their 14 yr old dog CJ and Fred, a 2 yr old cat who often terrorizes CJ.

Joe's charitable activities started years ago beginning with the Dobson (High School) Band Parents Assoc. He would pack off with hi-school kids during summer for their week long band-camp-in-the-pines. As cook, he prepared all meals every day for 175 teenagers and from that time continued donating his energy to church and other activities over the years. His working career includes restaurant management and maintenance

locally and on a national level with a large chain of restaurants. He later started his own business cleaning restaurants, including their exhaust systems (meaning all the "yucky stuff" from fry burgers and other such foods...a process that would make you switch to a vegetarian!!).

Joe at one point had a hobby collecting fish aquariums and it got to a point that Barb finally said, "too many, TOO MANY!" and now they have none. This did however prompt the beginning of an aquarium maintenance business that Joe continues PT today. Finally Joe and Barb are proud grandparents of 3 grandchildren by son Christopher and his wife Jennifer who currently live in Virginia.
