APRIL FOOLS DAY - April 1

Sometimes called All Fools Day, is one of the most light-hearted days of the year. Its origins are uncertain. Some see it as a celebration related to the turn of the seasons, while others believe it stems from the adoption of a new calendar. April Fools Day is observed throughout the Western world. Practices include sending someone on a "fools errand," looking for things that don't exist, playing pranks, and trying to get people to believe ridiculous things.

EARTH DAY CELEBRATION - April 22

Its a celebration of life on this planet and is celebrated around the world in over 175 countries. It brings focus to environmental and humanitarian issues on a large scale. Earth Day is usually celebrated on March 21st. Two organizations lay claim to initiating the first Earth Day celebration. One group was founded by John McConnell, and the idea was introduced at the U.N.E.S.C.O. (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization) conference in 1969. The group settled on the vernal equinox, which happens on either March 20th or the 21st. This is the day when day and night are of equal lengths and is the first moment of spring in the Northern Hemisphere, the first day of fall in the Southern Hemisphere. But the actual celebration of earth day is on April 22nd.

PALM SUNDAY - April 1

On Palm Sunday Christians celebrate the triumphal entry of Jesus Christ into Jerusalem, the week before his death and resurrection. For many Christian churches, Palm Sunday often referred to as "Passion Sunday", marks the beginning of Holy Week, which concludes on Easter Sunday. Palm branches are usually given to all parishioners on that Sunday.

EASTER SUNDAY - April 8

Easter Sunday is considered the most important Christian holiday. It celebrates the resurrection of Jesus Christ three days after his death. It is popularly celebrated with egg hunting, toy bunnies, Easter baskets, egg decorating and coloring.

Do You Have Cataracts? by Midge Drouin

A cataract is a painless, cloudy area in the lens of the eye. A cataract blocks light from reaching the retina (the nerve layer at the back of the eye) and may cause vision problems. Cataracts are common in older adults and are associated with aging. Smoking and exposure to excessive sunlight are additional risk factors.

Cataracts can also occur after an eye injury, as a complication of eye disease, after the use of certain medications, or because of certain medical conditions, such as diabetes.

Cataracts in adults are treated with surgery if vision problems are interfering with the person's quality of life. Surgery for a cataract involves removing the clouded lens of the eye. The lens can be replaced with an artificial lens called an intra ocular lens implant (IOL). Or if an (IOL) cannot be used for any reason, it will be left out and contact lenses, or rarely eyeglasses can compensate for its absence. Most people will get an IOL during surgery.

There's a new gate going in at our back entrance to the Park. It will be powered with Solar Energy and for what it's worth, you can say that Desert Harbor is doing its part towards saving the planet. Mental health can be improved through casino activities -- higher levels of concentration, improved memory, and increased problem solving skills are some of the good effects of playing bingo, keno, slots, or table games.

For the most part, senior citizens realize that their chances of winning a huge Jackpot are slim, but they enjoy socializing with others, chatting on the bus trips, eating breakfast or lunch with their friends, and just plain visiting. They are responsible gamblers who set limits to their spending and do other things once that limit is met.

Ham Loaf Recipe by Connie Riter

(This recipe is over 50 years old and was originally made by my Mother-in-Law, Evelyn. She served it with macaroni and cheese and red jello with whipped cream.)

1 lb. ground, smoked ham.

1 lb. ground, fresh pork.

3/4 cups cornflake crumbs

½ tsp pepper

2 eggs, beaten

1 cup milk

Mix well.....Shape as a loaf in a Pam-sprayed loaf pan.

½ cup brown sugar

1 tbsp. dry mustard

1/5 cup apple cider vinegar.

Mix sugar, mustard, and vinegar together and pour over ham loaf. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour.

I let it chill overnight, then cut it in slices in another pan, pour a little beef broth over the slices, and heat it up before serving. This extra touch brings out the flavors....
