August is a long, hot, humid month in Arizona (as most of us already know). The monsoons are in full force with their winds, thunder and lightning, and torrential rains (in some areas). It is a good month to get away from the stifling heat and lazy days (if you can). For those of us who remain here throughout the month, here are some facts about Arizona which you might find interesting to read and ponder.

Arizona has 3,918 mountain peaks and summits – more mountains than any one of the other Mountain states. All New England, plus the state of Pennsylvania would fit inside Arizona. Our disparate climate can yield both the highest temperature across the nation and the lowest as well – in the same day! Arizona has 90 wilderness areas – more than the entire Midwest! It contains the largest contiguous stand of ponderosa pines in the world stretching from near Flagstaff along the Mogollan Rim to the White Mountains region. Yuma, Arizona is the country's highest producer of winter vegetables, especially lettuce. Out of all the states in the United States, Arizona has the largest percentage of its land designated as Indian lands. The "Five C's" of Arizona's economy are: Cattle, Copper, Citrus, Cotton, and Climate. More copper is mined in Arizona than all the other states combined, and the Morenci Mine is the largest copper producer in all of North America. The world's largest solar telescope is located at Kitt Peak National Observatory in Sells, Arizona. Arizona grows enough cotton each year to make more than one pair of jeans for every person in the United States.

When England's famous London Bridge was replaced in the 1960's, the original was purchased, dismantled, shipped stone by stone and reconstructed in Lake Havasu City, where it still stands today. It was re-built on dry land, then the Colorado River was diverted to flow under it! Built by Del Webb in 1960, Sun City was the first 55-plus active adult retirement community in the country. The hottest temperature recorded in Arizona was 128 degrees at Lake Havasu City on June 29, 1994. The coldest temperature recorded was 40 degrees below zero at Hawley Lake on January 7, 1971. The entire state of Massachusetts could fit inside Maricopa County (9,922 sq. miles). There are many more unusual facts about our State, but we'll save them for another hot, humid August!

National Park Senior Pass Price to Rise

Time is running out for outdoors lovers age 62 and older to take advantage of a great bargain. The price of a lifetime Senior Pass good for admission to national parks and federal recreation lands where fees are charged, will jump from \$10 to \$80 on August 28.

The pass (currently \$20 if purchased online) is good for admission to 137 National Park Service sites that charge fees. It covers the pass holder and up to three more visitors age 16 and older. Pass holders also get discounted fees for camping, swimming, boat launch, and other services. The Senior Pass can also be used at sites managed by the US Fish and Wildlife Service, Bureau of Land Management, Bureau of Reclamation, US Forest Service, and US Army Corps of Engineers.

The fee increase was mandated by Congress as part of December 2016 legislation to raise money to pay for park projects and visitor services. That legislation requires the price of the lifetime Senior Pass to be the same as the Interagency Annual Pass, which is currently \$80 for one year, according to a NPS press release.

There is a way for patient seniors to spread out the \$80 cost of a lifetime pass over four years. The legislation introduced a new annual pass for seniors priced at \$20. Anyone who purchases annual passes over the course of four years can trade those used passes for a lifetime pass. Details: Go to store.usgs.gov/pass for price and purchase information for all national parks passes.
