Labor Day by Connie Riter

As our 100+ days begin to cool and students settle in for another year of schooling, we have a little break now with Labor Day and its celebrations. It is one of 10 federal holidays and pays tribute to the American worker movement. While we celebrate it now with barbecues, family gatherings, sports events, shopping, or just watching TV, the holiday has a bloody history and came about after a long battle for workers' rights in the country.

The first Labor Day was celebrated on Sept. 5, 1882 by the workers of NY City who held a parade organized by the trade unions. It was overseen by the group who later became known as the AFL-CIO. Oregon, however, was the first state to have an official Labor Day when its legislature made it official in 1887. Over the next few years 30 other states passed Labor Day legislation, and in 1894, Congress voted to make it a national holiday and President Grover Cleveland signed it into law. The holiday evolved out of decades of tensions between workers and their unions on one side and state security forces and employers on the other. During the last two decades of the 1800's, workers carried out over 37,000 strikes and over 800 workers were killed by police or military forces. The tensions culminated in the Pullman Strike when employers cut pay by 30% but kept cost of goods they sold in their company stores at fixed prices. The government sent in military to enforce the court injunction against the strike. Riots occurred which resulted in 30 deaths and \$80 million in damages. This is when Grover Cleveland signed the holiday bill in an effort to appease the workers. Most countries celebrate Labor Day on May 1st, but in the US and Canada it is observed on the first Monday in September as a way to get away from the socialistic roots of the May 1st celebration. Looking at our country today we can see some of the same conflicts that were occurring 200 years ago – we have violence, death, bombings, arguments among neighbors, trade wars. We see racial tensions, police killings, sexual promiscuity among politicians and church leaders. None of these are new—they are just a different facet of an old problem. Peace is elusive. Perhaps as we celebrate another Labor Day, we can find a way to bring peace and harmony into our own lives. We can see from history that many people have fought for it.

SUMMER RECIPES by Midge Drouin

Raymond & Cheryl moved into lot #15 from the state of Colorado.


They both are retired and will live here full time.
