BILL BOUDREAU, As many of you know my husband, was one of those who passed away. He was a very private introspective and loving person. He began helping the Activities Organization during Ken Camp's first presidency. Ken was organizing a silent auction. Bill said he felt we could do better than yellow tablet paper for bid sheets. Bill began designing posters announcing activities, sign up sheets, tickets and other printed material for the Activities Organization. Before he left for the summer, he had material prepared for those known activities through Thanksgiving. He was my right-hand man during the creation of material for the Fun Days. He enjoyed visiting with other residents especially his neighbor Doug Harris. They visited almost daily for coffee, cigarettes and as Doug would say good old Missouri BS. Bill enjoyed spending time on the Gasconade River in Missouri. If the fish weren't biting, he would float down and motor back up stream and do it again. He loved Arizona's landscape and shared as much of it as he could with visitors. The Apache Trail to Roosevelt Lake, Desert Botanical Garden. Besh Ba Gowah and the Superstition Museum were a few of his favorites. He was able to share these with his grandchildren Elloura and Oliver, daughter Kristine and son-in-law Neil Lockhart when they visited from London during their Easter break in 2017.

He served 4 years in the Service (2 of which were in the Marines) where he was deployed as Corpsman to Vietnam. In 1963 he left the Service and after meeting and later marrying his first wife Joan they moved to San Diego, Ca., before settling in Arizona. Unfortunately they never had any children of their own but he was everybody's favorite "Uncle Harry". After Joan's passing in 2000 it wasn't until May of 2012 when he and Liz moved into Desert Harbor from Queen Creek, AZ. Harry was a Religious Man and until his health failed him, he loved singing in the choir with his best friend Jean Hansen (another resident of the "Harbor"). And he was best known for his barb-que ribs and his love of Mexican Train Game Nights (Dominoes).

He loaded it onto a trailer and took it home to Estevan for a new paint job. For several years the Canadian residents have hosted a dinner dance for all the residents. Doug and Bertha assisted with the preparation and hosting of the evening. Doug and their dog JJ were often seen cruising the streets of Desert Harbor in his golf cart. Doug

would say to JJ "Lets go visit Bill" and she would beat him to our door. One morning I heard something outside and he was building a bridge to make it easier for Bertha to come over to our home. Another time I found him sanding our security door preparing it for a new coat of paint. Doug was a successful business owner in Estevan however, who enjoyed his winters here in Arizona. An evening at the casino was a great way to top off a full day for him. He also, enjoyed visits from his children and friends who came to escape the winters in Canada. He was a wonderful neighbor who is very missed.


