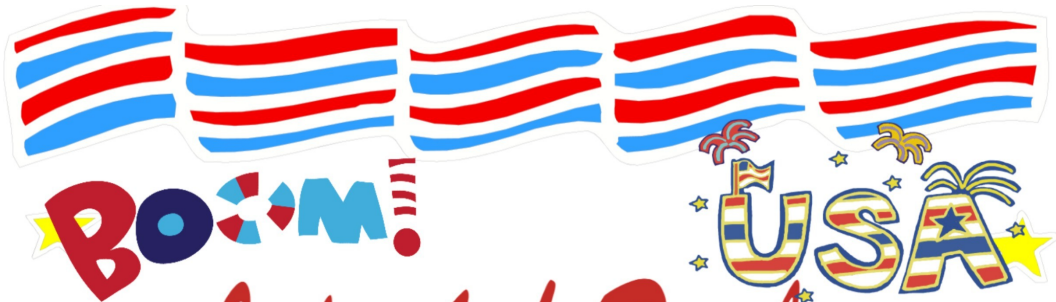

EGG BAKE RECIPE

(was used for the Father's Day Brunch)

Spray pan and spread out 1 package frozen O'Brien hash brown potatoes.

Beat together:

9 eggs 1 cup milk 1/2 tsp salt dash of pepper

Pour over potatoes, spread 2 cups diced ham and 2 cups grated cheese over all.

Cover with foil and refrigerate overnight.

Next day bake at 375 for one hour covered, then uncover and bake 5 minutes more.

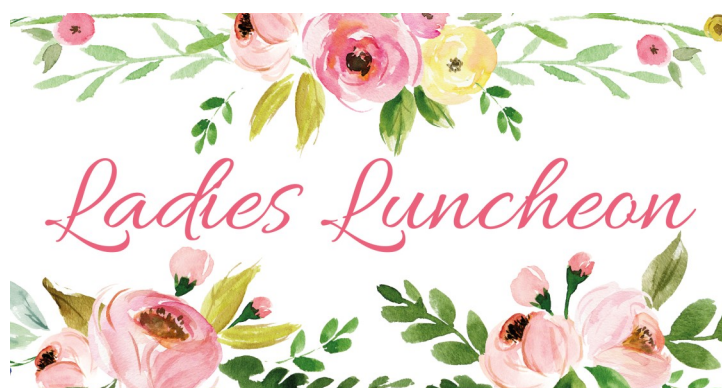
He does a great job of playing all kinds of music so you don't want to miss it.

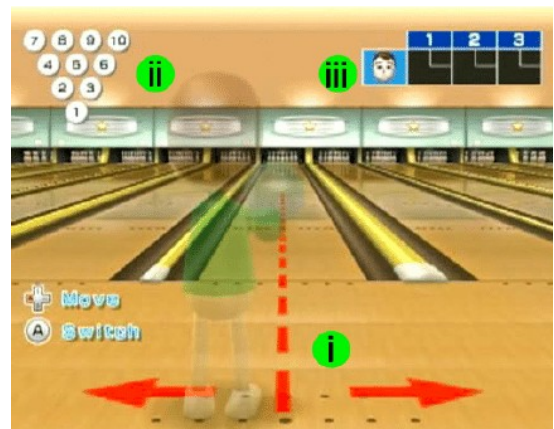
Pina colada dump cake

Ingredients

2 sticks butter
3 cans chunk pineapple drained
1/3 cup rum or pineapple juice
1 box yellow cake mix
2 cups sweetened coconut flakes

Preheat oven to 350

Melt 1 stick of butter in 9x13 pan. Add juice or rum. Spread pineapple evenly over mixture. Sprinkle cake mx and coconut (I mixed mine together) over pineapple. Cube last stick of butter and place over the cake mix. Bake 50-60 minutes. If coconut browns too much cover with foil. Cool and enjoy
May serve with ice cream or whipped cream.

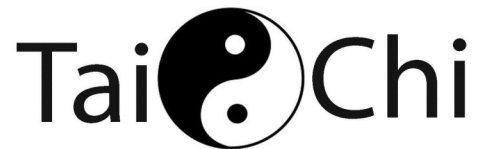

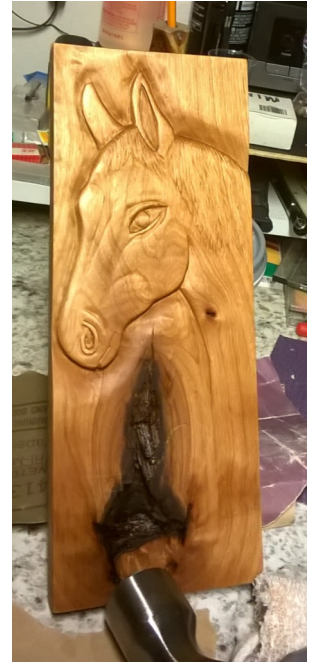
Judy worked for 3M for many years. She found their house in Desert Harbor on line, and they moved here in 2014.

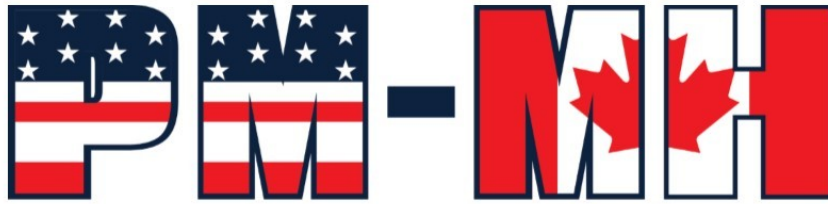
