
Ladies Luncheon Out at Angry Crab Shack by Bea Goudeseune

As time goes on, it is getting more and more difficult for him to get the supplies he needs for his projects and the colors he likes. He sits and watches sports as he works on a project. BROCCOLI AND CRAB BISQUE

BROCCOLI and CRAB BISQUE

- 1 c. sliced leeks
- 1 c. sliced fresh mushrooms
- 1 c. fresh or frozen (thawed & drained

chopped broccoli

- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1/4 c. butter
- 1/4 c. flour
- 1/4 t. dried thyme, crushed
- 1/8 t. pepper
- 1 small bay leaf
- 2 c. chicken broth
- 1 c. light cream
- 3/4 c. shredded Jarlsberg or Swiss cheese
- 1 (8 oz.) pkg. frozen crab meat, thawed & drained

In 3-qt. saucepan, cook first 4 ingred. in butter until tender. Blend in next 4 ingred. along with a dash of salt. Add broth & cream all at once. Cook until thickened & bubbly for another minute. Add cheese & stir until melted. Add crabmeat & heat through. ==== 6-8 servings.


