### **RESIDENT SHOWCASE**

This month, we are spotlighting another crafter in our community. Her name is Cynthia Schauer and she lives in # 206. Cyndy lives with her significant other, Don Walker. They originally came from Southern California in a little city called Cerritos. They have been residents in our park since January, 2006.

Before Cyndi moved here to Desert Harbor, she was a seamstress who made bridesmaids' dresses and along with that she also did quilting. In the past, she has also tackled one-stroke painting. She also painted on shirts, did rhinestone designs on jackets, and put kits together for assorted cards.

Cyndi started her card making crafts in the 1980's. She joined "Stampin-Up" which is a distributor for designing cards. She took a little time off and then got back into cards again where she now has over a hundred stamps, a hundred dies plus, and five different machines for die cutting, embossing, foiling, and more. These are all for making cards. Originally, Cyndi says a friend of hers got her into card making.

Cyndi does a few local shows...in fact her next show will be in our park at the clubhouse in November of this year.

I asked her if she ever gives classes for making cards and she replied "not really", but if a person just wanted to start on a small basis, they would need supplies such as: ink, card stock, scissors, glue, tape, tweezers, and a pokey tool. It's not a cheap craft to get into. But, Cyndi does sell her cards if you need one or two. She does a variety of cards such as: birthday, anniversary, thinking of you, best wishes, Christmas, get well, and Easter.

Her newest challenge is "Pop Ups" and box cards. She is always looking for a new challenge. Come over to her table at our craft sale in November to see her new items.

### Have You Ever Wanted to Tour the Tovrea Castle?

Two years ago, I signed up for a tour of this "Wedding Cake House" in Phoenix, which can be seen from the 202. Our date for the tour is October 10<sup>th</sup> at 9 am and tours are limited to 12 people, which is the number of tickets I bought way back then. I still have tickets to sell, so if you would like to go with our group, see me with your \$20 before the end of September. Then we will have to decide if we will drive down or hire an Uber. Back on June 30, 2019, they released another group of tickets which they said would probably sell out in a few hours. The 2 hour tour includes the 5,000 sq. ft. main floor and basement as well as the 44 acre grounds and cactus garden.

What is the Tovrea Castle? It is that giant "wedding cake" castle you have probably driven by on the 202 by Van Buren and 52<sup>nd</sup> Streets. It was built by Alessio Carbaro, an Italian immigrant who got rich in the sheet metal business in San Francisco, before moving to Phoenix in 1928. His plan was to build a resort and housing development. He finished it in 1930, but his dreams of making it a resort didn't pan out, perhaps due to the presence (and smell) of a nearby meat packing plant. He sold the property in 1933 to Edward Tovres, a cattleman who probably didn't mind the meat packing plant.

Tovrea died not long after making the purchase, but his widow lived there alone until she died in 1969, and Phoenix acquired the property in 1993. The city opened the castle and its gardens to the public in the spring of 2012 and the tours have been a hot ticket item ever since.

Again, see me if you would like to go with us and we will have a meeting of the group going when the tickets are all sold to see if we would like to go somewhere for lunch after our tour. Let's make a "fun day" of it!


