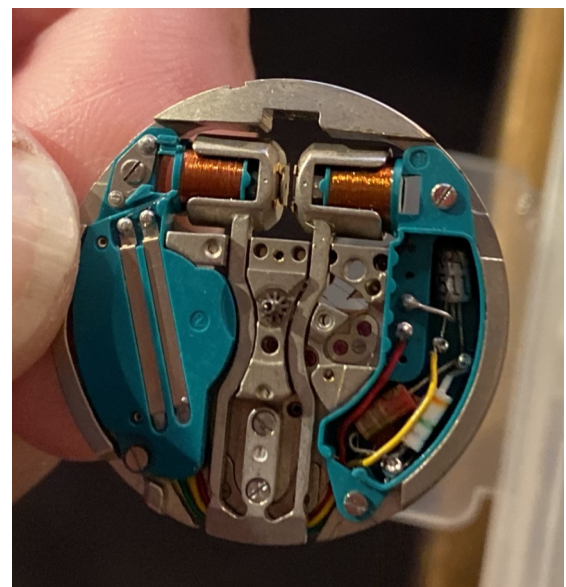
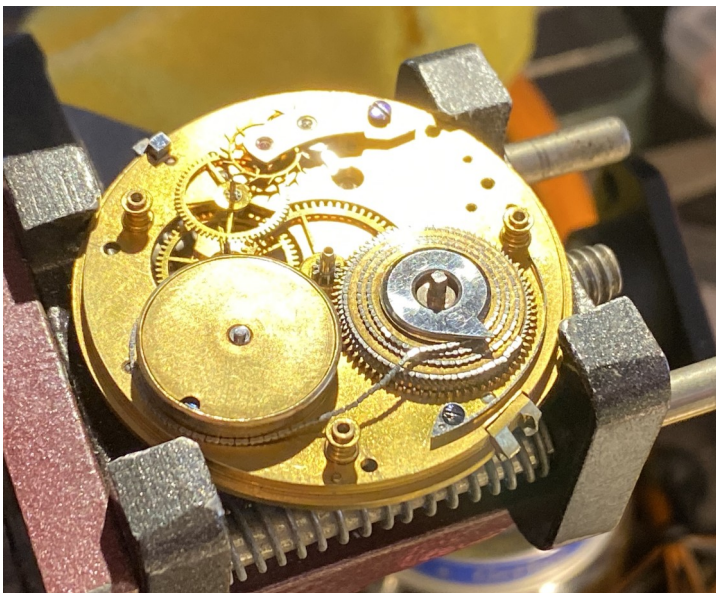

Our Trip to the “Wedding Cake Castle” *by Connie Riter*

On Thursday, October 10th, a group of 12 residents drove to Tempe during morning rush hour traffic so we wouldn't be late for our early morning tour of the Tovrea Castle. (You can see this castle which looks like a light tan wedding cake as you drive on the 101.....but to get a tour of the castle takes months of planning.) I have wanted to tour this castle and grounds as soon as I heard the city was going to open it up for tours in 2012. Then in 2017 I was able to get on line and plan a tour. But the earliest date I could get was October 10, 2019! Apparently a lot of people want to see the inside of the castle and tours are not given every day.

Arriving 15 minutes ahead of our time as they suggested, we went into the gift shop to await the arrival of our tour guides and other visitors. We boarded two golf carts and drove around the 40 some acres of cactus gardens planted around the house. Many opportunities for Kodak moments. The gardens are surrounded by walls of stones which were salvaged from the Salt River since Mr. Tovrea liked to re-purpose everything. In the cactus gardens themselves, the stones are painted white. This gives a beautiful contrast to all the cactus. There are also areas where visitors could sit and relax outside and an area which may have been built for swimming, but was never completed.

The original purpose of the castle was to house bed and breakfast visitors but circumstances prevented it ever being used for this purpose. The neighbors started raising cattle and the stench would have scared away guests. Also the economy tanked.

The tours consist of seeing the gardens in the golf carts followed by visiting the basement and first floor. In the basement which is like a museum of artifacts from the earlier days of the castle, one can see original lamps used on the castle and a huge advertisement that a Tovrea son did when he opened the castle for tours earlier. The ceiling in the basement is most unusual. It looks like a bird's nest and while the construction workers were working on it, they put several little eggs in the ceiling – as you walk around, you are encouraged to find 4 little nests. (I found one!)

Then when you get ready to view the first floor, you have to put booties on your shoes so you don't scratch the heavily polished wooden floors. In this area you see an old fashioned radio and an RCA Victrola, a small area with one of the original dresses worn by Della Tovrea and an upholstered chair which was in the original house when she was there. There is also a glass case containing a gorgeous coffee set which was presented to Edward Tovrea by the city for winning a Christmas decorating contest. In this living room is also a large fireplace with lovely artwork above it.

Then you visit the kitchen also on this floor. The original stove and ice box are still there and the ice box has been converted to also run on electricity. The cupboards in the kitchen are beautiful dark wood which Mr. Tovrea was able to save from a bank which was closing. He was always trying to find items to re-purpose. At some point while Della was living in the castle alone, Edward died within the year of purchasing the castle, two men attacked her in the kitchen and fired a shot into the ceiling. The bullet hole is still there.

Della was very active in Democratic politics and worked hard for women's rights. She served from 1940 to 1956 as a Democratic National Committeewoman. The castle remained part of the Tovrea estate until it was purchased by the City of Phoenix in 1993. If you get a chance to see the Castle yourself, I think you would really enjoy it!

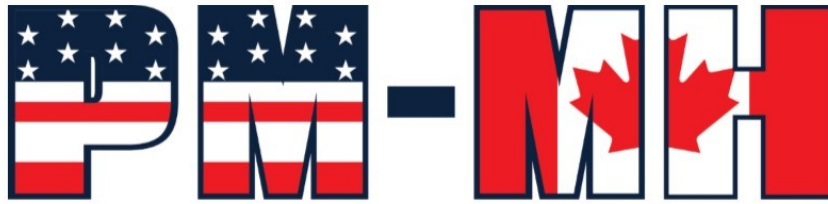
