From the Kitchen of Barb Nienkark

As many of you know, a Betty Crocker I am not. I like simple, easy recipes with ingredients that I understand and can readily access at my local grocery store. That being said, I hope you will enjoy making and serving this simple but delicious dessert.

Cherry Dump Cake

- 1 16 oz. jar of Maraschino Cherries with juice
- 1 box of Betty Crocker Super Moist Devil's Food Cake Mix
- 1 cup cola flavored carbonated soda pop.

Rich drinks Cherry Dr. Pepper and I think the cherry flavor adds a little zip to the cake mix.

Into an 8×12 or 9×13 ungreased glass baking dish pour the cherries and juice. I usually neatly arrange them in equally spaced rows and remove any stems, if necessary. Mix the cake mix and pop and spoon over the cherries spreading gently. Don't worry, as the cake bakes the cake mix warms and spreads out.

Bake 28 - 30 minutes in a preheated 350 degree oven until a toothpick comes out clean. Serve with ice cream or cool whip and enjoy!



If you would like to purchase a name tag, there is a sheet in the back of the Clubhouse to order one. Please PRINT YOUR NAME, your lot number, the


State from which you came, and if you need a pin back rather than a magnetic back. I will order them after the resident meeting each month.
