Easy Eggnog Pumpkin Pie

1 can (15 oz.) pure pumpkin (not pumpkin pie mix)

1 ¼ cups prepared eggnog

2/3 cup sugar

1 ½ teaspoon pumpkin pie spice

¼ teaspoon salt

3 large eggs

Pie Crust-frozen deep dish

1 cup heavy or whipping cream for top when serving.

Preheat oven to 375F. In large bowl with wire whisk, mix pumpkin, eggnog, sugar, pumpkin pie spice, salt and eggs until well blended. Place piecrust on foil lined cookie sheet on oven rack, pour in pumpkin mixture (mixture will come almost to the top).

Bake until filling puffs up around edges and center is just set but not puffed, 60-70 minutes. Cool completely on wire rack. Refrigerate until ready to serve.

To serve, in small bowl, with mixer at medium speed, beat cream until stiff peaks form. Garnish each serving with whipped cream sprinkled with pumpkin pie spice.

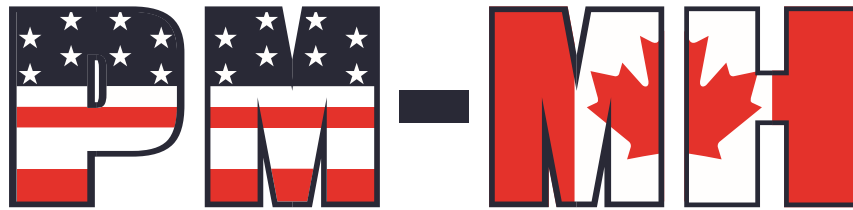

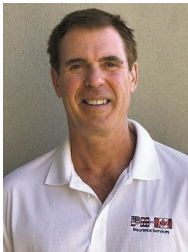
