<u>August</u>, a word that means "inspiring reverence or admiration," is the name of the eighth month of the year in our Gregorian calendar. It's the sixth month of the ancient Roman calendar used by the Roman kingdom and republic. Back then, the month of August was known as *Sextilus*, Latin for "sixth month." In 8 BCE, the month was named in honor of Augustus Caesar, the first Roman emperor.

Who is the man August was named for?

The emperor was a man of many names. He was born Gaius Octavius, the grandnephew of Julius Caesar. He took the extended name Gaius Julius Caesar Octavianus in 44 BCE after Caesar's assassination. Though in English texts, he was often referred to simply as Octavian.

Then in 31 BCE, he defeated Mark Antony and Cleopatra to gain control over the empire. Finally in 27 BCE, when he was named emperor, he was given the honorary title *Augustus*.





Directions

1.Combine pineapple juice, sugar, eggs, flour, and 1/2 tsp salt in a sauce pan. Stir and cook over medium heat until thickened. Remove from heat; stir in lemon juice. Let cool to room temperature. About 1 hour.

2. Bring a large pot of water to a boil; add oil and remaining 2 tsp of salt. Add pasta and cook until al dente, 5 to 7 minutes. Drain and rinse under cold water.

3. Combine cooked pasta, cooled egg mixture, mandarin oranges, pineapple tidbits, crushed pineapple, and whipped topping in a large bowl mix well. Refrigerate until chilled 8 hours to overnight.

4.Before serving, add marshmallows and coconut toss and serve. Can also add drained maraschino cherries and mandarin oranges on top for garnish. Enjoy.
