December 13 We have a Cookie Decorating class. Don't forget to sign up for the which will take place.





Chocolate Peppermint Sheet Cake



YIELDS: 24 serving(s) PREP TIME: 30 mins TOTAL TIME: 1 hr 15 mins

Ingredients

FOR THE CAKE:

- 2 c. all-purpose flour
- 2 c. granulated sugar
 - 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. baking soda
- 1/4 tsp. kosher salt
- 1 c. salted butter (2 sticks)
- 1/2 c. unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1 c. boiling water
 - 1/2 c. whole milk
- 2 tsp. peppermint extract
 - 2 large eggs

FOR THE FROSTING:

- 1 lb. powdered sugar
- 1 c. salted butter (2 sticks), at room temperature
- 2 tbsp. whole milk
 - 1 tbsp. vanilla extract
- 1 c. crushed candy canes or peppermint candies

Directions

- Preheat the oven to 350°. Line the bottom of a 13-by-18-inch rimmed baking sheet or a jelly roll pan with parchment 1.
- 2. For the cake: Whisk together the flour, granulated sugar, baking powder, baking soda, and salt in a large bowl. Heat the butter and cocoa powder in a small saucepan over medium-low heat, whisking, until melted and smooth, about 2 minutes. Carefully add the boiling water, allow it to bubble for a moment, then remove from the heat. Add to the flour mixture and stir until smooth, about 1 minute. Let cool 5 minutes.
- Whisk together the milk, peppermint extract, and eggs in a large bowl. Stir the milk mixture into the batter and mix 3. until smooth. Pour the batter into the prepared pan and spread evenly. Tap the pan firmly on the counter a few times to remove any air bubbles.
- Bake until a toothpick inserted into the center of the cake comes out clean and the top springs back when gently 4. pressed, about 20 minutes.
- 5. For the frosting: Beat the powdered sugar, butter, milk, and vanilla in a large bowl with a mixer on low speed until combined, 2 to 3 minutes. Increase the speed to medium and beat until light and fluffy, about 2 more minutes.
- Spread the frosting evenly over the cake and let set about 15 minutes. Sprinkle diagonal lines of crushed candy on the 6. cake. For even lines, lay 2 pieces of parchment on the cake to act as a stencil, then move them as you go.


