## The History of Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving Day is a national holiday in the United States, and Thanksgiving 2023 occurs on Thursday, November 23. In 1621, the Plymouth colonists from England and the Native American Wampanoag people shared an autumn harvest feast that is acknowledged as one of the first Thanksgiving celebrations in the colonies.

## Thanksgiving Becomes a National Holiday

During the American Revolution, the Continental Congress designated one or more days of thanksgiving a year, and in 1789 George Washington issued the first Thanksgiving proclamation by the national government of the United States; In It, he called upon Americans to express their gratitude for the happy conclusion to the country's war of independence and the successful ratification of the U.S. Constitution. His successors John Adams and James Madison also designated days of thanks during their presidencies. In 1817, New York became the first of several states to officially adopt an annual Thanksgiving holiday; each celebrated it on a different day, however, and the American South remained largely unfamiliar with the tradition.

in 1863 Abraham Lincoln scheduled Thanksgiving for the final Thursday in November, and it was celebrated on that day every year until 1939 when Franklin D. Roosevelt moved the holiday up a week in an attempt to spur retail sales during the Great Depression. Roosevelt's plan, known derisively as Franksgiving, was met with passionate opposition, and in 1941 the president reluctantly signed a bill making Thanksgiving the fourth Thursday in November.

### **Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade**

Parades have also become an integral part of the holiday in cities and towns across the United States. Presented by Macy's department store since 1924,

New York City's Thanksgiving Day parade is the largest and most famous, attracting some 2 to 3 million spectators along its 2.5-mile route and drawing an enormous television audience. It typically features marching bands, performers, elaborate floats conveying various celebrities and giant balloons shaped like cartoon characters.

Beginning in the mid-20th century and perhaps even earlier, the president of the United States has "pardoned" one or two Thanksgiving turkeys each year, sparing the birds from slaughter and sending them to a farm for retirement. A number of U.S. governors also perform the annual turkey pardoning ritual.

### Apple Enchilada Dessert

These apple enchiladas are simply apples rolled in flour tortillas. They are very delicious, easy, and fast to make. Substitute apples with peaches or cherries if desired.

**Prep time:** 15 mins **Cook Time:** 25 mins **Total Time:** 40 mins

### Ingredients

1 (21 ounce) can apple pie filling  
6 (8 inch) flour tortillas  
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon, or more to taste  
½ cup white sugar  
½ cup packed brown sugar  
½ cup water  
⅓ cup butter

### Directions

- Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
- Spoon fruit evenly onto all tortillas and sprinkle with cinnamon. Roll up tortillas and place seam side down on a lightly greased 8x8-inch baking pan.
- Bring white sugar, brown sugar, water, and margarine to a boil in a medium saucepan. Reduce heat and simmer, stirring constantly, for 3 minutes.
- Pour sauce evenly over tortillas; sprinkle with extra cinnamon on top to taste.
- Bake in the preheated oven for 20 minutes.

### Tips

This recipe makes 6 large tortillas; but may be cut in half to serve 12.
