**The Origin of Easter:** Easter originated as an ancient pagan celebration of the spring Equinox. ( This occurs when the Sun crosses the celestial equator going south to north.) **Fun Fact:** Equinoxes are the only two times yearly that the Sun rises due east, and sets due west, for all of us on the Earth) For Christianity, Easter day was dedicated to observing the resurrection of Jesus Christ, celebrated around the time of the Jewish Passover. Early Christians, who did not participate in the Jewish customs, eventually merged their ceremonies with the pagan spring festival, recognizing Easter as “ resurrection day.”

**Today’s modern Easter Traditions:** They come from a blend of Christian themes and ancient pagan celebrations. Such as: decorating eggs, bunnies, and sweets.

**The Easter egg** , one of the most recognizable symbols along with the Easter bunny , goes back to ancient Babylonians; they believed that an egg fell from heaven into the Euphrates River and “ hatched the goddess of fertility. ( Astarte, also known as Ishtar and yes Easter) Pagans exchanged eggs as gifts during their springtime festival. Today, eggs are painted in all colors and designs, which brings family fun and togetherness; they are hidden for children to locate and collect.

**The Easter bunny** represents the season of spring and fertility. The Easter rabbit originated from the pagan festival of the goddess Eostre. This celebration paid tribute to the renewal of the Earth and the rebirth of life, after the dead of winter.

**The white lily** relates to what we know of as the Easter Lily. Lilies are associated with purity and resurrection, and some people believe that lilies grew in the Garden of Gethsemane, where Christ prayed the night before his death.

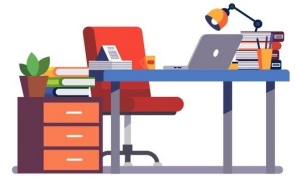
Other symbols associated with Easter are the cross, crucifixes and palm branches, which hold significant teachings for Christians. We also see chicks and chickens.

**Easter is a celebration**, of all that is good, whether your belief lies in Christ, and or the beauty of family gatherings and fun, a time to enjoy one another’s company, and bringing smiles to the faces of children.

## Resident's Meeting February 3, 2024

Resident's Meeting February 3, 2024

Meeting was called to order by President Sandy Baumstark at 9:00 AM. All present stood for the Pledge of Allegiance. We had 79 residents in attendance.

She provided a plethora of information on various vacations she has upcoming and places she's booked previously. Her company provides day tours, cruises, and other exciting destinations. President Sandy Baumstark took roll call, and all Board Members were present. She then inquired whether we had any new residents in attendance. There were none at this meeting.

President Baumstark inquired whether everyone had read the previous months Meeting Minutes and if there were any questions or comments. None were made, so motion was made by Betty Zaslowsky to accept and was seconded by Richard Nienkark.

Member Neal Meyer reported that donations were provided to Hope Women's Shelter. This drive was for one day and various needs were given. Suggestions were made that we do this again with more time provided for residents to collect items to be donated. Will discuss at a future meeting.

Member Bonnie Harrison reported that the Community Sale has moved from March 9<sup>th</sup> to March 23<sup>rd</sup>. That gives us more time to clean out those closets and storage sheds. We will be taking donations at the beginning of March. No clothing will be accepted, and all electrical items must be in working order. We will have crafts, and baked goods as well.

Member Rhonda Smaldino reminded everyone that we will be raffling off Beverage Coolers during the Community Sale. All beverages can be taken to Rhonda's house (Lot 155) or let her know and she can pick them up. Tickets are \$5 for one (1) or \$20 for five (5). Also, if you could donate a cooler, it would be appreciated.

Residents inquired about the monthly Newsletter, i.e., how many are printed, what's the cost, etc. President Sandy Baumstark stated that she thought 100 were printed but would check. Also, the Newsletter is online as well as the website. Due to the cost do we need that quantity? Neal will research cost versus advertising and have those numbers at the next meeting.

Connie Riter has the information for the Dutton Theater if anyone would like to go. Need a count and payment prior to booking seats.

Cord Price will be performing on Saturday the 3<sup>rd</sup> from 6 to 9 PM.

The Super Bowl Party will be on the 11<sup>th</sup>. If you plan on attending, please sign up so we can get a count for pizzas. All squares for the football pool are full.

Valentine's Day is the 14<sup>th</sup>. We will have a DJ (Steve) from 5:30 till 8:30 PM. Come on out and dance with your favorite dance partner.

Card Bingo will be on Sunday, February 18<sup>th</sup> beginning at 6PM. The cost is 9 quarters and \$1. Everyone always has fun at this activity.

On the 24<sup>th</sup> we will have a Potluck beginning at 4:30PM. After that we have Dakota Kid performing from 5:30 PM to 7:30 PM. No meat will be provided.

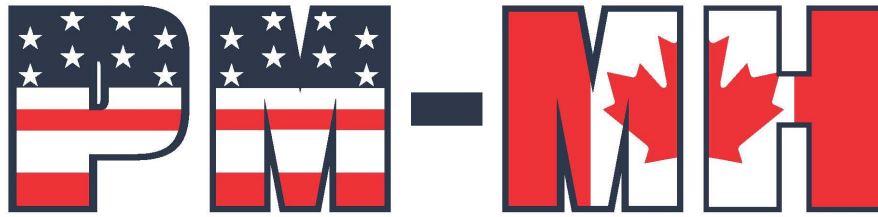

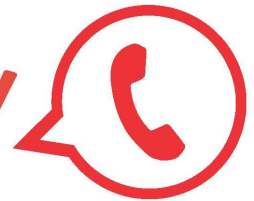
