Due to the cost, Thanksgiving Dinner will be our standard potluck with the Board providing the Turkeys. We will continue to research having Christmas Dinner catered.

Cami Weiss stood and asked that everyone Volunteer to be Host/Hostess of these potlucks. The same people continue to get the job done. We need to get involved and not leave it up to the same people or Board to do all the work. There is a sign-up sheet on the back wall. Sign up!

HOST AND HOSTESS DUTIES

- Start about an hour before the event time, place salt & pepper shakers on each table, tables should already be set up.
- Place table numbers on each table (depending on how many people and tables we have).
- Please be sure to have everyone that will be handling or serving food wear gloves. **THIS IS A MUST.**
- Make sure tablecloths are on each long table (one for desserts and three for serving food).
- Put dinner paper plates on the end of the long table and smaller plates on the dessert table.
- Put silverware and napkins on the long table (knives, forks, and spoons in wicker baskets). Also, knives, forks, and spoons on the dessert table.
- Get serving spoons, spatulas (for desserts) and tongs, if necessary, on each table where needed.
- Make coffee (either one large pot or two small pots depending on the weather and how many are signed up).
- Make sure sugar, creamer and stir sticks are on the counter with coffee cups.
- As residents arrive, welcome them, and instruct them where to place their dish and uncover the food when ready to serve.
- Make sure the PRAYER is being said. It is on the wall next to the front door of the clubhouse.
- Call everyone for dinner by using the numbers on the table or calling a playing card.
- After the meal is over, remove salt and pepper and table numbers or cards.
- Pass out wipes to each table for them to clean them. Wipe down each table with a clean cloth.
- Empty coffee pots, clean and store.
- Wash all utensils and put them away,
- Clean counters and any other dishes that belong to the clubhouse.

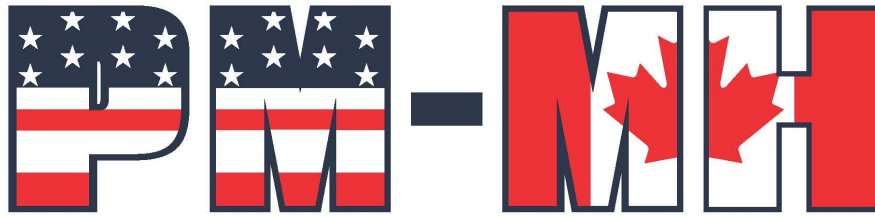

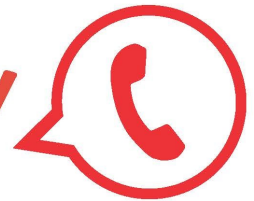
